## Advent

Advent is a season of preparing - not only to look back and remember Christ's coming as the baby Jesus, but also preparation in anticipation of Christ's now-and-not-yet coming into the world; preparing for God coming to meet us - and be born in us - every day and in many ways. So, Peace will follow the prophetic call to "Turn and Return to God" (Joel 2:13) as we dance through Advent, looking back to remember and looking forward with hope.

**ADVENT 1:** Is a celebration of seeing God in the Turning of the Seasons, as we worship with The Greening of the Church, a centuries-old tradition of decking our worship space with the symbols and songs of Advent and Christmas in preparation for the coming of Christ.



**ADVENT 2:** Is a time for reflection as we heed God's call to turn and return our whole selves to God's care and God's will.

**ADVENT 3:** Is our Intergenerational Christmas Pageant in which we hear the voices of the prophets call all of society to turn and return to God by creating cultures of justice and peace.

**ADVENT 4:** We join the eternal turning of the stars as we celebrate in Word and Music the Light of Christ coming into the world.

Join the celebrations as creators, leaders, readers, actors, dancers. Invite your loved ones, neighbors, friends and co-workers. Let this Advent be a time of turning and returning in your life, a time of remembrance and a time to look forward; a time of preparation and hope.

## PARISH NURSE NEWS

### Christmas: Let There Be Peace on Earth (and in our families!)

This season can bring a sense of joy, wonder and gratitude. It’s a time to gather with family and friends and celebrate the birth of Jesus. But for some of us, Christmas can also be a time where past family dynamics and difficult relationships arise. This year, after a divisive political season, we may encounter family members or friends who have very different views and we worry this might bring a cloud over the usual celebrations. Some gatherings result in conflict or hurt feelings. This can be hard on our physical, emotional and spiritual health.

Here is when we need to remember that the message of Christmas (and of the person of Jesus) is to bring light into a world of darkness. Jesus brought love, tolerance, compassion, respect and kindness into a world of inequality. Jesus taught us not to shame, humiliate, embarrass or “get back” at others but to pave a “new way” in our relationships. Jesus taught us that every person is a child of God, fully worthy of unconditional love and acceptance. Can we accept that grace for ourselves and extend it to others?

Christmas gatherings are not the best time to try to discuss past hurts or conflicts or resolve relationship problems. But Christmas might be a time for you to step-back and reflect on what is causing your relationship issues: “What are the thoughts and feelings I have that are getting in the way of my ability to offer love, tolerance, compassion, respect and kindness to someone else?” “What might be the perspective of the other person?” “Is it time to ‘let go’ or get help from a professional in order to heal these past hurts, criticisms, assumptions?”

We know we can’t change another person’s behavior, thoughts or feelings...but we have the power, with God’s help, to change our own. And the most surprising gift of all is when we fill our hearts and thinking with love and kindness, we often experience true joy and a peace that passes understanding.

This Christmas, may the words of this song resonate in each of our hearts: *Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me.*


