Through FMF, congregations take turns opening their doors, providing a safe and comforting place for families experiencing homelessness. In the past, many guests have mentioned how Peace is a favorite place to stay, due to the wonderful people and hospitality. Especially for children, the playground, nursery and individual rooms create a very positive environment.

The hands that have prepared countless meals, ears that have listened to difficult stories, and hearts that have poured time and energy into FMF are a testament to the people of Peace putting their faith into action. For over twenty years the people of Peace have been a beacon of Christ's light for others, and made an impact in the community. As one of the FMF guests said, "The huge number of people from Peace who are volunteering their time gives me inspiration to be involved in the church and the community."

COUNCIL COLUMN

Notes from the September 8 meeting:

Treasurer Lance Novak reported that our year-to-date giving continued ahead of budget in August and overall expenses are tracking to plan. However, to help with the approved budget deficit, he recommends the Building Committee reduce repairs and maintenance spending by about \$5,000. The projected year-end cash balance is \$12,000.

An updated Lead Pastor job description was created and approved by Council. Also, the Church Assessment Tool planning and analysis timeline was discussed. Pastor Kjell reported plans for a fall Stewardship Drive. Also, Pastor Emily is working with committees to create a multigenerational Sunday School and Confirmation curriculum.

Looking Out for the Children



MINNEAPOLIS CRISIS NURSERY SPEAKER AT PEACE

Sunday, October 4

Raising children is full of joy (and also some challenges). But imagine if you were in a situation where you had lost your job, money was tight, it was an effort to feed and clothe your children and you didn't know which way to turn. The Greater Minneapolis Crisis Nursery (GMCN) is an organization whose mission is to end child abuse and neglect and create strong, healthy families. The Health Ministry at Peace invites you to attend an Adult Forum on Sunday, October 4 provided by the Crisis Nursery to learn more about its many programs. One of these programs is a 24 hour crisis line for parents with young children who are facing crises in their lives, and concerned that their stress could result in harm to their children. The Crisis Nursery is available to help these parents in many ways including: counseling, support and even a residential option where their children (ages 0-6 years) can be temporarily cared for in a healthy environment.

Laura Castle, Peace's new Communication Specialist, spends time volunteering at the Crisis Nursery:

"I spend time at the GMCN as a child care volunteer two mornings a month. I have spent much of my life working with children in various educational and ministry based settings — and the children at the nursery are no different than most — they want and need someone to love and pay attention to them. The nursery is a place where they can receive this love and care in a positive environment. It's been refreshing to be part of an organization that values the development of each individual child, and promotes resiliency within families."
