How might Peace reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church?

In January, Peace met with facilitator Eva Jensen to examine the results of the Church Assessment Tool (CAT) and to plan for the future. One of the three priorities addressed that day was "to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of Peace." The Evangelism and Communication Committee is implementing an idea that came from that day — "100 Invitations." The entire congregation will work together to invite 100 people to Peace between the middle of May and the end of October.

Invitations can be to: worship, Day Camp, Sunday School, a fellowship group, or a special event. It's up to you! During worship on Sunday, May 8<sup>th</sup>, everyone will receive an "invitation to invite". After you invite someone, fill out a card (available during worship that day and at the information desk) and turn it in to the box on the information desk. This way the congregation can be updated as we reach our goal and celebrate together!

Most of all, think about whose life could be enriched by your personal invitation to attend something in this church community.

Notes from April 12, 2016

The meeting began with devotions led by Dave Forsberg, and a reading of Isaiah 55:10-11. Pastor Kjell reported on the Building Use Task Force activities and discussion with Bloom Preschool and Childcare. Pastor Kjell reported on various initiatives that staff and committees are currently pursuing, including: worship planning, international and local mission planning, a building use policy, and an employee handbook. There was discussion about the 3 priorities identified in the congregational assessment (CAT) survey. The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

# Summer Worship Themes

For many years most mainline denominations have shared the ecumenical Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which prescribed Bible readings for each Sunday's worship. The RCL focused on a different Gospel (Matthew, Mark, or Luke) through each of its three-year cycle, with readings from John sprinkled throughout all three years. A coordinating Psalm, Hebrew Testament and Epistle Reading were paired with the Gospel texts each week. In 2012, a group of Luther Seminary professors, intent upon improving Lutheran's Biblical literacy, created an alternate lectionary, called the Narrative Lectionary, which flows from Genesis through Revelation, September through May, with optional sections of readings for the Season of Pentecost (summer). Peace has been using the Narrative Lectionary the past two years. This past February, a group of people gathered to choose the themes, liturgies and hymns for this upcoming Pentecost season. To all who joined the planning: thank you for all your ideas, wisdom and input! These are the three themes Peace will be studying in worship during the summer:

June 5 - 19: 1st John June 26 - July 17: The Lord's Prayer July 24 - September 4: Revelation

We will offer a time focused on healing and prayer after communion where anyone with a need to be "restored" physically, emotionally or spiritually can have Pastor Kjell or Sondra pray with them and be anointed with oil. If there are others in your life that need healing, we can pray for them too. After the service, stop by for a healthy treat and sign cards that will go to our homebound members. Thank you to everyone at Peace for supporting this ministry of caring and health.

#### A health ministry testimony...

Lisa is one of the many Peace members whom our Parish Nurse, Sondra, visits on a regular basis. Lisa agreed to be interviewed for the newsletter to help Peace members understand the role of Parish Nurses. Lisa has multiple sclerosis and stage 4 ovarian cancer and has great difficulty leaving her home due to mobility issues. Although she wasn't a member of Peace at the time, her mother, who is a member and who Sondra was visiting, asked if Sondra would mind visiting Lisa. After a few visits and receiving communion from Sondra, Lisa expressed interest in joining Peace. Pastor Kjell made that possible in a ceremony at her home. Sondra visits monthly, listens and assesses Lisa's health issues. When appropriate, she suggests resources that might be of help. One resource was Gilda's Club, a new organization providing support to cancer patients and their families.

Lisa stated, "I am grateful to Peace Lutheran for their prayers, thoughts for me and our family. Just knowing that you are praying for me on Sundays gives me energy and positive feelings. Without Sondra, I wouldn't have a connection to the church. She has been a conduit to a stronger faith that has helped me through these trying times. She has given me a purpose and reason to communicate with Christ in a way I can understand and respect. Her knowledge of the health care system and the importance of our spirituality and faith in our health has been a gift not only to me but to my mother as well."

Lisa's cancer is in remission...and she counts that as a miracle because when she was diagnosed several years ago, her doctors only gave her two years to live. She said that because she has a small family, it is a blessing to now be part of the larger church family of Peace Lutheran.

# UPDATE ON POTENTIAL PARTNERSHIP WITH BLOOM

Recently, Peace announced it is exploring the possibility of having a Bloom site at Peace. The first joint meeting between Peace's Building Use task force and Bloom's Strategic Planning committee has taken place and the group determined a full feasibility study is necessary. Four areas of study were identified: *mission/vision, facilities, finances and legal*. By the end of May they will know how long it will take to complete the feasibility study (likely late summer or early fall). If you have any questions or ideas please contact the Building Use Task Force: Mike Mostrom, Valerie Sorenson, David Forsberg, Dave Swanson, Lance Novak and Pastor Kjell. As that investigation continues, Peace will host some Bloom staff and board to help Peace learn about Bloom's mission, service to the community and partnerships with nonprofit organizations.

#### **BLOOM FAST FACTS**

- Dedicates half its capacity to low income children through their community funded Scholarship Program.
- Scholarship students are not only ready for Kindergarten, they exceed standards and expectations based on feedback from teachers at Wayzata Public Schools.
- Bloom scholarship students performed "at or above grade level" in first grade based on testing by Wayzata Public Schools and the results held at third grade.
