Peace believes in home and joins other west metro communities of faith in announcing a new housing initiative in Plymouth. Cranberry Ridge will be located on Highway 55 near Old Rockford Road (18220 Hwy. 55) and will be home to more than 45 working families.

find in the western suburbs. Most of the families who will live at Cranberry Ridge will earn between \$16,000 and \$45,000. Some apartments will be set aside for families who have lost their home and need assistance to get back on their feet financially.

PARISH NURSE NEWS

Severe weather season is here! Are we prepared at Peace? Here are some reminders of the Safe Church protocols we have in place for severe weather. Remember these terms:

Severe Thunderstorm Watch—weather conditions are favorable for producing severe thunderstorms. Remain alert and stay informed **Severe Thunderstorm Warning**—severe weather has been reported. Seek shelter immediately

Tornado Watch—weather conditions are favorable for tornadoes; remain alert for approaching storms

Tornado Warning—a tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar; take shelter immediately

On Alert—we have a weather radio in the church office which will alert us if there is severe weather in the area. If you have access to the office you can listen to that radio. It's also suggested you have a severe weather alert on your cell phone.

When there is a severe weather warning while you are in the church building, it is best if you go to the areas marked by the orange SEVERE WEATHER signs to take shelter. The restrooms are one of the safest places to be, but there are other areas marked in the building. Always avoid windows. In the event of a severe weather warning during a worship service, ushers should quickly evacuate the sanctuary and move persons to the designated SEVERE WEATHER areas. For parents who have children in the nursery or Sunday School, teachers have been instructed to take the children to those SEVERE WEATHER areas as well.

We appreciate your cooperation with our severe weather protocols and welcome your suggestions or ideas for how to make Peace as safe as possible everyone.


