Bloom Update

Over that last year and a half, Peace has explored partnership with Bloom Early Learning and Childcare. One of the options was Bloom opening a second site in Peace's building. Largely because of the needed updates to Peace's facility the startup costs were very high and Bloom was able to find a more economical partnership with whom to do their expansion. The Building Use taskforce will now restart their work of finding a partnership to more fully utilize Peace's building space in a way that furthers Christ's mission in our community.

We Love Having Your Children in Church

I often watch young families in worship and sense some of the tension parents feel when their little ones have trouble sitting still or being quiet. I wish I could tell the parents right then and there, *"It's okay! We love having your kids in worship.*" (and I often do right after the service!)

I understand that it's tough, as a parent, to be able to relax and worship when your children are demanding your attention. And, for little ones aged 0-3 years, we have a nursery staffed with experienced babysitters from 8:30-11:30 a.m. who will lovingly care for them.

We encourage your use of the "busy bags" that are in the back of the church and want you to feel free to bring coloring books or other quiet activities. We also have a small table with coloring books and puzzles outside the sanctuary where you can still hear the sermon if it does become necessary to take your child out of worship.

But, try not to worry too much if your child makes some noise or cries or whines. Child development experts have found that it's very hard for young children to sit quietly with nothing to do for an hour of worship. And when we expect children to do things they're not developmentally able to do, we only create frustration for them and for ourselves. The last thing we want to do is create a dislike for going to church because we, as parents, are punitive, impatient or mad at them when they're there.

Peace wants to foster a climate where young children learn to love being with their "church family" in worship. We want your child to feel that he or she is an important part of Peace right now! They don't need to wait until they can pray, sit quietly or worship in a certain way. Your devotion to helping them learn to worship will have awesome rewards. It takes time, but eventually, your child will be worshipping right alongside you following along with songs, prayers and stories of Jesus and the Bible.

I know it's hard, but thank you for what you do when you bring your children to church. Please know that your family — with all of its noise, struggle, commotion, and joy — are not simply tolerated, you are a vital part of the Peace community gathered in worship.

This year Peace confirmation kids are doing an activity called Confirmation Reformation. This is a group where kids from different churches meet. There are ten churches involved and seventy kids. We didn't spend too much time on each floor which kept everybody awake and moving. My favorite thing that we did was the tour of the Synod Office because I loved the view from the 6th floor and they do super cool things at the Synod Office like build schools in Haiti.




