


The season of Advent is upon us once again. How will you prepare for Christ's coming this year?

Update on the chaplaincy program in Latvia

Peace received a report from Dana Kalnina-Zake in Latvia. Dana is one of the first certified chaplains in Latvia. Our former Pastor, Andris Sedlins, was a member of the certifying board. Peace Lutheran Church supported the education and certification of chaplains in Latvia after Latvia's independence from the Soviet Union. Peace planted the seeds and helped nourish those seeds. The seeds have taken root, but the Latvian chaplains still face many challenges as Dana describes the success and challenges in her article. Please enjoy an excerpt of her article here.

Challenges and Hopes after 20 years -Hospital Chaplaincy of Latvia

The Association of Professional Health Care Chaplaincy of Latvia (LPVAKA) was founded in 2005 as a result of a long history of greatly inspired and hard working group of hospital pastoral care givers in Latvia and our friends and supporters in the USA, among whom there is a special place for Peace Lutheran Church. Without you our work and achievements would not be possible!

I have been with LPVAKA since the beginning; I am a hospital chaplain for over 14 years now and belong to the Lutheran Evangelical Church of Latvia. My daily work is

to head Spiritual and Social Care Services in the main university hospital in Riga - Paul Stradins Clinical University Hospital. Since 2005 I, together with 9 other hospital chaplains from various denominations, founded the Association of Professional Health Care Chaplains, most of us - women theologians. Some of us are still trying to collaborate and trying to find ways to support each other. Unfortunately it becomes more and more difficult with each year for us to sustain ourselves and to get professional support (supervisions) or financial. This year I have started a formal training for supervision in a three year course accredited by the Association of National Organization for Supervision and Coaching in Europe (ANSE). All those years since 2005, I was among just a few in LPVAKA, in my church and in fact all of Latvia who lead clinical pastoral education program and supervised hospital chaplains and diaconal workers. But the time has come for us to seek more grounded and elaborate education in supervision as our professional, psychological and spiritual demands and challenges have grown greatly!

Giving Tree at Peace Bloom Early Learning

This year for the Peace Giving Tree, we are partnering with Bloom Early Learning & Child Care out of Plymouth. On the tree, in the gathering space, you'll find ornaments with gift requests from two family. These individuals are supported by Bloom, who helps families outside the IOCP area.

Bloom Early Learning & Child Care was established in 2000 and is an accredited center with the mission to make quality childcare fun and affordable for the community. Bloom aims to save half of their capacity for single-family and low-income families; the cost of high quality childcare is often extremely difficult or impossible for these families to achieve. In order to provide quality education to these families, Bloom provides scholarships.

The children at Bloom range from six weeks to five years and come from all backgrounds, which fosters a strong and diverse community. The curriculum and programing is value-based that often results in children leaving the Bloom program well equipped both in school and social situations.

A non-profit and 501(c)(3) organization, Bloom is partially supported by faith communities such as Peace, businesses, individuals, and civic organizations. They partner with a number of other entities such as Interfaith Outreach & Community Partners, Caring for Kids, the Wayzata School District and government agencies to help support and empower families who struggle financially.

Bloom is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children and is 4-Star Parent Aware rated. For more information about Bloom, check out their website at www.bloomearlylearning.org/

January, 2019: Resolve to Complete Your Health Care Directive and other Important Documents!

Important forums on January 6 and 13th

As the new year arrives, we often make resolutions about our health. But this year, I want to encourage you to take care of the critical documents you may have been putting off completing. These documents are your

- Health Care Directive (often called Living Will or Health Care Power of Attorney)
- A will and/or trust
- Durable Power of Attorney for Financial Affairs

Please don't put this off any longer! Whatever your age, you need to have a document that indicates your wishes if you should suddenly become unable to communicate your health care choices to others. This document is called a Health Care Directive and it's not just for older people! Anyone 18 years and over needs this document. What if you were in an accident or experienced a serious illness? Would your parents, spouse, children know what type of treatment you would want? If not, your loved ones would struggle to know your wishes and may make decisions you would not want them to.

Your will, Power of Attorney for Financial Affairs and other documents will indicate who should take care of your children if you're unable to pay your bills or take care of other financial matters. If you die, who will take care of your possessions and estate no matter how small or large?

Did you realize that, without planning, your loved ones could end up in the courts for long periods of time and spend a lot of money to obtain legal permission to take care of your children or financial affairs? And the chance of conflict and hard feelings greatly increases without these important documents.

Peace is giving you an opportunity to complete your Health Care Directive and learn about other aspects of advance planning. **On Sunday, January 6 from 10-11:30 a.m.** attend a session where you can complete your directive and have it witnessed so it is legal. On Sunday, January 13 from 10-11 an attorney will speak about the other documents mentioned above. Even if you have documents from the past, this new year is a perfect time to take a look at these documents to be sure they are still appropriate.

Please put these dates on your calendar now and make plans to attend so you can take care of these critical actions early in 2019!


