


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Why Jesus?

OPERATION BOOTSTRAP AFRICA

For well over a decade Marv and Ruth Larson have supported girls from the MaaSAE Lutheran Secondary School in Tanzania. The school, started by Lutheran missionaries, educates girls from the area west of Arusha--in the shadow of Mt. Kilimanjaro. The school was started in 1995 with four teachers and one of them was a member of Peace, Jane Tellekson. Today there are over 325 girls from impoverished backgrounds leaning in this nurturing environment.

Peace Lutheran has a long history with the Maa-SAE school, having sponsored the entire second class of girls from 1996 through the early 2000's. Peace continues to support this mission; this fall we are paying for the construction of new desks for an entire classroom. The desks will be made with local materials and local workers. This means that Peace's generosity not only provides students with a place to sit and learn but also needed cash and meaningful work for families in the community by the school.

Last year, Peace funded five partial scholarships. The total cost for a student to learn and live at the school is \$1000 per year. This year, Peace is continuing to fund those partial scholarships; this means the same students we supported last year will have the same opportunity this year.

Education Makes a Difference

An education triples a woman's income. She will reinvest about 90 percent of her income into her family. With a secondary education, she will marry later and have 2.2 fewer children and is seven times less likely to contract HIV/AIDS. Her children also benefit and have a 40 percent better chance of living to age 5.

Keeping Children Safe at Peace

We all want Peace to be a safe place for children. When we create a safe environment, we can better focus on telling God's story, sense belonging in this faith community and live out the God-given purpose in our lives.

In September, 2018, teachers and volunteers who work with children and youth attended a safety training workshop and completed background checks. In addition, members of the staff recently attended a workshop sponsored by the ELCA that emphasized safe boundaries in working with children and youth.

The Safe Church task force, the Children's Ministry and the staff at Peace have developed several guidelines to help keep children and youth safe. Here are just a few of them:

- All staff, teachers and volunteers working with children and youth must submit and pass a background check before starting their work.
- Volunteers supervising children or youth must be active at Peace for a minimum of six months before providing direct service to children or youth.

All staff, teachers, volunteers will avoid be-

ing alone with a child/youth in a place that cannot be observed by others.

- All staff, teachers and volunteers shall intervene whenever seeing behavior among children, youth or their supervisors that is bullying, demeaning, or harmful.
- If anyone becomes aware of an inappropriate relationship or behavior between an adult and a child/youth he or she must immediately report it to the Pastor or Parish Nurse who will follow Peace's protocol.
- Those who are considered mandatory reporters must follow the guidelines from the State of Minnesota re: reporting signs of abuse, neglect or maltreatment.

Peace is updating written policies and procedures and, over the next several months, will be reviewing, revising and adding to them. If you are interested in helping with that project or have questions, please contact Sondra, Chris Bacon, or Pastor Kjell. We want Peace to be a welcoming, secure environment for all.
