Why Vocation? Romans 14 says, "Whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." The second part has most often been used at funerals, but it fails to capture the full confession, in *all of life*, we are the Lord's. With this claim comes the call to fully live life in Jesus' name. We as Lutheran Christians utilize the word "**vocation**" to understand that **we who have been claimed by Christ in our baptisms are a called people**. We believe that vocation is significant for the church in today's world for the following reasons:

- God is present and at work in the world.
- We as individuals and as a community are called.
- Our vocation/calling is not just lived out in our professional life. It includes all the roles in which we find ourselves: family member, friend, citizen, worker, etc.
- We are likely to be more or less passionate about different roles we are called into; each realm matters because each realm is lived for the sake of our neighbor and the world God loves.
- Vocation calls us to deep engagement with the messiness of our world and lives, believing that God is already at work.

This is why Peace Lutheran is deeply committed to engage vocation through small groups and preaching with the whole congregation. We are very excited to see what this will mean for Peace and the lives of each individual within it.



Stewardship is giving to God. Stewardship is giving control of our lives to God. It is about taking seriously the words that we pray: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done." When we pray, "Thy will be done," we ask for what God wants to happen in our lives to take place. During the first three weeks of October, Peace will look specifically at God's generosity and our participation in God's giftedness.


