Come and Worship at Peace!

Once again the holidays have come and gone; the coming of the Savior was prophesied in the Old Testament and Jesus was born. With the dawning of the new year we transition from the Old Testament into the New Testament. We will spend the winter and spring of 2020 making our way through the gospel of Mark and hearing the stories of Jesus' ministry from that book of the Bible.

We will start on January 5th with six weeks of Marty Haugen's Tree of Life liturgy. Then we'll finish up the season of Epiphany with a brand-new liturgy: the Confirmation students are putting together a service

inspired by the ministry they experience at Blble Camp. They will be leading worship on February 16 and 23.

For our Sunday mornings in Lent we will return to the well-known Holy Communion Setting 4 in the ELW hymnal, composed by Ron Nelson. We will worship at 6:30pm on Wednesday nights with the Holden Evening Prayer service.

The season of Easter begins on April 12th, and throughout April and May we will sing Hans Peterson's Earth Keeping Liturgy. We will wrap the program year with the Music Festival on May 24th!

Vocation: FAITH IN DAILY LIFE - Bunny Rova

Bunny Rova is living her vocation one stitch at a time. Recently Peace member Bunny Rova donated two hundred pairs of mittens to Interfaith Outreach. This is a labor of love for Bunny, who has been knitting and donating mittens for decades. We wanted to know more about how this vocation began for Bunny, and what keeps her motivated.

"It is in my genes – my mother was a prolific knitter," says Bunny. While at the University of Minnesota, all of her friends played bridge, but she would knit. For her then-boyfriend Bill, she made a pair of argyle socks and complicated scarf which took ages to make. His mother shrunk the socks and he forgot the scarf at a college dance. She married him anyway!

In 1993 Peace Lutheran began having a "mitten tree" and Bunny contributed 53 pairs. Her mission continued and in 2020

"I do love knitting. You sit and think your own thoughts, and nothing hinders; you are infinitely lazy and yet you are accomplishing a good deal." Harriet Prescott Spofford, Harper's Bazaar, November 5, 1892 she will reach her goal of 3,000 mittens. "My friends at Peace have a big role in my mitten projects. Countless women have given me their leftover yarn, yarn from their mothers, or just a little ball of yarn – enough for a stripe or two or a thumb. I give a special 'shout out' to Pam Johnson. Through the years she has been my 'outreach' hands and she gets the mittens where they are needed." For many years Pam would bring them to the Marie Sandvik Center in Minneapolis, but this year they went to Interfaith Outreach. Interfaith Outreach's Development Director, Lani Willis said, "We often talk here about 'just-in-time miracles.' These mittens were just-in-time miracles for the many hands and heads that will be warmed by their caring and craft!"

Although she can knit a challenging Norwegian sweater,

following charts and counting rows, mittens are more relaxing, and it is a rare day that she does not work on them. "This is Minnesota and there are a lot of kids (and grown ups) who need mittens. I can do this – I can do a little bit." Bunny is seeking the thriving of her neighbors by using her gifts of knitting. She is claimed by the love of God and called to make the world a better place for all. Knitting is part of Bunny's vocation.

Vision Team

The Vision work continues! This effort kicked off alongside the Grace & Vocation series and will enable Peace to increase the focus on our theological claim and to get better results by doing what matters most. Peace is clarifying our identity, strengths, challenges, and opportunities for ministry. We are developing a 3-5 year vision and written strategic plan that guides the congregation toward living into our mission and values.

Activity to date:

- Completed the Congregational Vitality Survey: Thank you for taking the time to share your voice and perspective! Your input is invaluable in shaping Peace's strategic plan. To ensure we received as much input as possible, the survey was extended through mid-December.
- Began connecting with local community leaders to listen and learn how the church might service and connect with its residents.

What's Next:

- Present community demographic information to the congregation. A Defining Our Community session is scheduled for Sun, Jan 12, 10am.
- Share the consolidated view of our data gathered to date.
- Continue to assess the Peace's strengths through congregational interviews.

Future Activities:

- Host a visioning retreat designed to clarify congregational priorities.
- Create a ministry plan or road map to guide the congregation's efforts for the next 3 years.
- Introduce the plan to the congregation and assist members with discerning how they might contribute to its fulfillment.
