VISION Team

The VISION Team continues the effort of creating a 3-5 year vision and a written strategic plan for Peace Lutheran Church. This is a process of gathering information and clarifying our identity, strengths, challenges and opportunities for ministry.

The first data gathering activity was distributing the Congregational Vitality Survey to get input on the state of the congregation. Please join us during worship on **Sunday, February 16** to review the results of this survey. We've invited Jim LaDoux, a consultant with Vibrant Faith Ministries, to help review and interpret the data. Immediately following worship, we will offer an opportunity to discuss the results and ask questions or provide further input about the information presented.

Other details about visioning work completed and future activities include:

Activity to date

- Connecting with local community leaders to listen and learn how the church might service and connect with its residents.
- VISION Team has begun reviewing Vitality Survey results.
- Reviewed community demographic information in the Defining Our Community session.

Future Activities

- Continue to assess the congregation's uniqueness and strengths through interviews and observations of its norms.
- Host a visioning retreat designed to clarify congregational priorities.
- Create a ministry plan or road map to guide the congregation's efforts for the next 3 years.
- Introduce the plan to the congregation and assist members with discerning how they might contribute to its fulfillment.

Don't Get Scammed

Criminals use clever schemes to defraud millions of people every year. They often combine sophisticated technology with age-old tricks to get people to send money or give out personal information. They add new twists to old scams and pressure people, oftentimes seniors, to make decisions on the spot.

Common scams:

- 1. **Gift Cards:** Beware of anyone who is demanding payment through the use of gift cards. This is not the normal way to make a business transaction, yet millions of dollars are lost to scammers posing as a government agency, utility company or a representative of a business.
- **2. Grandparent:** Someone claiming to be a family member stranded far from home. They say they are being held in jail, need car repairs, or other assistance.
- **3.** Medicare or Bank: The caller works to get seniors to give them their personal information such as social security information, credit card or bank account numbers.

- 4. Bereavement: Criminals read obituaries, then call the widow or widower. They claim that the deceased had outstanding debts that need to be paid off immediately.
- 5. Sweepstakes and Lottery: Typically the victim receives a letter in the mail stating they have won or inherited a large about of money. The letter instructs the victim to send funds to cover taxes or administration fees and the victim never receives their prize.
- 6. Charity: Money is solicited for phony charities, often after natural disasters.

Don't be a victim. If you suspect that you are trying to be scammed online, delete the message. If you are on the phone, hang up. And, if you ever become a victim of a scam, report it to the police.
