
MANY: Help us to know that you are with us, and that only you are capable of turning all evil to good. AMEN

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Welcome to worship!

As we gather for outdoor worship in this time when the dangers of COVID-19 continue to be a reality, we do so with an emphasis on safety and on caring for one another.

Scripture teaches us to place the needs of those who are vulnerable first. In this spirit, all are expected to be mindful of the needs of others. Please read this guide carefully before you come to outdoor worship.



Stay home if you feel sick. The worship service will be viewable on youtube as usual. If you have any symptoms or aren't feeling well, do not participate in outdoor worship.



Bring a face mask. Plan to wear a mask if you are nearer than 6 feet to other people, or in case you need to go inside the building. Disposable masks are available if you forget to bring one.

Maintain physical distance. Physical distancing is important between family groups. Please maintain 6' distance. Respect each other's space. Parents are expected to limit the interaction of their children to only other consenting individuals.



Building access is limited to emergencies only. Restrooms will not be available.

We have not worshipped together in person since March! Though we cannot do all of our rituals, we can still have a spirit of worship. Come with an open heart, and **bring your own chair.**
