We firmly intend to amend our lives, and to seek help in mending what is broken.


We ask for strength to turn from sin and to serve you in newness of life.

SCRIPTURE from Exodus 12 & 13

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: 3 Tell the whole congregation of Israel that they are to take a lamb for each family. 4 If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. 5 Your lamb shall be without blemish; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. 7 They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. 8 They shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. 11 This is how you shall eat it: be fully dressed, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. 12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord.

Moses said to the people, "Remember this day on which you came out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, because the Lord brought you out from there by strength of hand. 5 When the Lord brings you into the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites, which he swore to your ancestors to give you, a land flowing with milk and honey. 8 You shall tell your child on that day, "It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt."
