
They thought the crowd was too loud and the parade was getting too big. "Who is that man?" someone asked. "What's going on here?" asked another.


The crowd answered, "This is Jesus! God's King! He has come to save us!"

Give us today our daily bread.


Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
