


WELCOME & ANNOUNCEMENTS

ABSOLUTION


ONE: Brothers and Sisters, in Christ's name and by his authority I declare + your sins are forgiven. Be freed from all guilt and shame that weighs you down.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Psalm 69: 1-8

The Psalms can be hard to connect with as present day readers, particularly when we do not share the life experience and historical contexts with the Psalmists. One powerful way to connect with these poetic prayers in our own context is to enter into reading with the question of "whose prayer is this today?" We invite you to hear this morning's Psalm as a prayer of one seeking refuge.

² I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold; I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me. ³ I am weary with my crying; my throat is parched. My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.

⁴ More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause; many are those who would destroy me, my enemies who accuse me falsely. What I did not steal must I now restore?

⁵O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you.

⁶ Do not let those who hope in you be put to shame because of me, O Lord GOD of hosts; do not let those who seek you be dishonored because of me, O God of Israel.

ONE: With the whole church, let us confess our faith in God, our refuge.


MANY: I believe in God, the Father almighty,
