## WHAT DOES BEING GENEROUS MEAN TO YOU?



When you think of generosity, what comes to mind? I invite you to reflect on that for a minute or two...

# YOUR STORY, OUR STORY, GOD'S STORY Vocation small group Bible study and sermon series

In his TED talk, David Isay, the creator of a national storytelling project called StoryCorps, says the following: "In an age where it can be hard to know what's real and what's an advertisement, listening to another person's story can be an experience that is authentic and pure. It can feel like you are standing on holy ground." As Peace gathers around "Together In Love," this study allows you to consider how your own life story's significance is deepened and shaped by the story of who God is for us in Christ Jesus.

Each week you will reflect on different parts of your story from a new perspective. Just as significant as telling your own story is listening to others' stories in your Peace family. "Together In Love" will be lived out as relationships are formed and deepened through the power of the story. Beyond the small group gathering, there is also an opportunity each week for private journaling. These practices—journaling and storytelling—can inform and enrich you. We invite you to try doing both. You may choose to share your journaling during that week's small group or remain in a private reflection space.

My name is Ty Stoffel, and I have been a part of the Peace Community since my baptism 17 years ago. Growing up, the church and people that make up our wonderful congregation have played an essential part in my life.

Another vital part of my life is Boy Scouts, and one of the last steps on my trail to Eagle was leading a community service project. I saw this as an excellent opportunity to give back to Peace, the community so important to me as I grew up.

For this project, we completely revitalized the outdoor space opposite the Church parking lot. We cleared weeds, small trees, and buckthorn for a wide wood chip-covered path through the oak grove. Additionally, we refinished the trellis arbor at the entrance and constructed two versatile flip-top benches along the path. We also planted two apple trees adjacent to the oak grove.

I am so thankful for all of the wonderful volunteers from our congregation who came out to help; we could not have done it without you. I also look forward to seeing this space in use. We put in a lot of work, so we invite you to come out and use this space to gather, pray, study, work, meditate or just relax. We built the space for you, so don't hesitate to check it out.

## **OPERATION BOOTSTRAP AFRICA**

Olchoki Primary School in Northern Tanzania serves approximately 1,400 children. Classes run from 7:00 am-3:00 pm each day. In January 2020, Operation Bootstrap Africa started a program that feeds all of the students and staff lunch that otherwise would very likely not get even one satisfying meal a day.

Attendance at the school was spotty, and the learning and passing rate was poor. With the help of generous donors like you, the children of the Olchoki Primary School in Arusha, Tanzania, are showing up and learning, passing their classes at a rate that was unthinkable before the program started, and looking forward to going to school. Since starting the program, over half a million lunches have been provided.

In 2022, OBA hopes to provide lunch for each of the 1,400 students at the school daily.





# **FAITH IN DAILY LIFE**

As a ten-year-old in Faribault, Minnesota, Jan McDowell noticed a boy on the school playground who "could really hit a ball and run very fast." She was impressed, and they became best friends. Many years later, they are *still* best friends. Jan married that athletic boy, Lee Yarger, and they have been married for 57 years.

Jan is a retired registered nurse who worked in oncology, home healthcare, and hospice. She was also a Parish Nurse. She and Lee had two sons, Jon and Chris. Jon is a Lutheran Pastor and the father of two. One granddaughter works with the homeless, and the other is a student at Northwestern



University in Evanston, IL. Jan and Lee's son, Chris, was killed in a snowmobile accident four and a half years ago.



Asked what she considers her vocations, she replies that she sees her vocations as being a wife, a mother, a grandmother, a friend, a neighbor, and a retired nurse. In living her vocations, Jan says that she tries to live her life with integrity and that she tries to live what she believes to be true. "I hope I exhibit tolerance and kindness, and love of people," she says. "I often ask myself, 'What would Jesus do?'"

Especially with Parish Nursing, her faith has helped her see and help people with their physical and mental health and their spiritual health. "Being able to talk about their faith and pray with patients was a privilege and a joy." When asked about the joys of her vocations, she responds that they are "the love received and given." But there are challenges, too. "When you love and lose someone, the grief never ends. It is especially hard to lose a child. You never get over it: you just learn to live with it."

Although she didn't mention it when listing her vocations, one special vocation of Jan's has been a pastor's wife. She wasn't incredibly anxious to have this as a vocation. When Lee asked her to marry him, she said she wanted to do so, but she wasn't sure about becoming a pastor's wife. "I didn't want to live my life and raise my children in a fishbowl," she says. A pastor's wife Lee knew, gave Jan some good advice when she considered Lee's proposal: the role of a pastor's wife is whatever it would be if your husband were the garbage collector! She took that to heart and found that being a pastor's wife was generally a joy and a privilege. She sang in the choir, played handbells, belonged to women's groups and Bible study groups, and volunteered as a Parish Nurse. She says her greatest accomplishment was starting a Free Clinic in their church, staffed by volunteer doctors, nurse practitioners, and nurses.

Jan and Lee joined Peace four years ago. Because Lee is often preaching as an interim pastor, Jan is frequently with him on Sunday mornings at the church he is serving. All the same, she has participated in Bible study at Peace, has helped with phone calls to members who might need extra help during Covid, has joined book study groups, and participated in Faithfully Fit classes. In joining Peace, it was the first time that she and Lee were "regular people," She says it was good for them to see the church from that perspective. "The church, at its best, is the most shining example of humanity caring for one another," Jan attests. Thank you for a lifetime of caring for others, Jan!

With the stock markets at or near all-time highs, some members may have appreciated stocks they would like to donate to Peace. Remember, a stock donation may be tax deductible for the stock's current market value, plus you won't have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciation in value if you donate the stock directly to Peace instead of selling the stock and donating proceeds. If you wish to donate stocks, contact your broker and instruct them to transfer the stock directly into Peace Lutheran Church of Plymouth's brokerage account at Charles Schwab.

Please email Peace's Treasurer, Jason Tofteland (finance@peaceofplymouth.org), to request the account number and DTC number and let him know you are transferring stock into Peace's account. He will then be able to sell it once it has been deposited in the church account.


