God-with-us -- appearing in the here and now.

ONE: Consumerism and materialism dull our senses to the extraordinary beauty of the Divine becoming human flesh.

MANY: We want Christmas now. Advent invites us to develop patience, to learn the power of hope, and the joy of expectation.

ONE: Advent is not merely preparation for remembering the occurrence of Jesus' birth 2000 years ago.

MANY: Advent points us to the hope of Christ coming again - every day.

ONE: Advent makes prophets of us all.

MANY: We are called to prepare ourselves, our church and our world for the approach of Christ, the Light of the World.

ONE: This morning, as we prepare this sanctuary for our celebrations of Advent and Christmas,

MANY: we practice preparing our homes, our lives and our hearts for the birth of Christ, here and now!



TRADITION: THE PARAMENTS & ADVENT COLORS

Exodus 25:1-8; 26:1

ONE: The LORD said to Moses: Tell the Israelites to take for me an offering... This is the offering that you shall receive from them: gold, silver, and bronze, blue, purple, and crimson yarns and fine linen, goats' hair, tanned rams' skins, fine leather, acacia wood, oil for the lamps, spices for the anointing-oil and for the fragrant incense, onyx stones and gems. And have them make me a sanctuary, so that I may dwell among them. Moreover, you shall make the tabernacle with ten curtains of fine twisted linen, and blue, purple, and crimson yarns.

NARRATION



TRADITION: THE ADVENT WREATH & CANDLES

John 1:1-9

ONE: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²The Word was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through the Word, and without the Word not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴in the Word was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

NARRATION

ONE: As we light this first candle on the Advent wreath, we focus on being good listeners during this season of waiting.

ONE: What sounds will we hear? What does it mean to listen for love?

ONE: Listen, God is calling. Listen, Christ is coming. Listen, someone needs your love.

MANY: Jesus is born in our listening. Above all things may we put on love, which holds all things together.

ONE: Let us pause now to open our hearts and listen for love.

ONE: May the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, as we listen for love together.

MANY: Open our ears to Christmas. AMEN



ONE: As we remember these evergreens, symbols of peace and joy, we share God's peace among us. The peace of Christ be with you all.


MANY: And also with you.
