GATHERING LITANY John 13:34-35

ONE: On this day - throughout our existence - the body of Christ has gathered to share the Holy Meal Christ has given us. In this supper, God's unfailing, self-giving love is poured out for the whole human family.

MANY: God's desire for our unity is made manifest around this table.

ONE: In this supper we are filled with - and renewed as - the Body of Christ;

MANY: from this supper we are sent out to serve our neighbors - those like and unalike ourselves - with the compassion, welcome and love of Christ.

ONE: For Jesus said: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

MANY: "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

ONE: This is Christ's command, the mandate which gives Maundy Thursday, its name. It is this command that compels all our action, the command which directs our existence. It is this command - to love one another - that ushers us into these Three Days.

MANY: "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."

ONE: With this command, let us begin our observance of these Three Most Holy Days by confessing our sin, our inability to live in love.

Silence for reflection.

ONE: Most merciful God,

MANY: we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. AMEN

ONE: God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were dead in sin, and made us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. In the name of \oplus Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit, that Christ may live in your hearts through faith. Come to the font to remember your baptism that you are washed in the waters of God's love and acceptance.

MANY: AMEN

WORD

PREACHING TEXT John 13:13-35

You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. 14 So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. 16 Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. 17 If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them. 18 I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But it is to fulfill the scripture, 'The one who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me.' 19 I tell you this now, before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe that I am he. 20 Very truly, I tell you, whoever receives one whom I send receives me; and whoever receives me receives him who sent me."

After saying this Jesus was troubled in spirit, and declared, "Very truly, I tell you, one of you will betray me." 22 The disciples looked at one another, uncertain of whom he was speaking. 23 One of his disciples—the one whom Jesus loved—was reclining next to him; 24 Simon Peter therefore motioned to him to ask Jesus of whom he was speaking. 25 So while reclining next to Jesus, he asked him, "Lord, who is it?" 26 Jesus answered, "It is the one to whom I give this piece of bread when I have dipped it in the dish." So when he had dipped the piece of bread, he gave it to Judas son of Simon Iscariot. 27 After he received the piece of bread, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him, "Do quickly what you are going to do."28 Now no one at the table knew why he said this to him. 29 Some thought that, because Judas had the common purse, Jesus was telling him, "Buy what we need for the festival"; or, that he should give something to the poor. 30 So, after receiving the piece of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night.

When he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. 32 If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. 33 Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' 34 I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just

as I have loved you, you also should love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

Stripping the altar—removing all ornaments and linens—is an ancient Maundy Thursday custom of the Church. It is symbolic of the disciples' abandonment and Jesus' humiliation at the hands of the soldiers. It also reminds us to strip away our own armor - all that would protect us - from the pain, confusion, and groundlessness of the coming betrayal, denial, trial and crucifixion.

¹My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

my heart within my breast is melting wax.

¹⁵My strength is dried up like a potsherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of death.

¹⁶Packs of dogs close me in, a band of evildoers circles round me;

they pierce my hands and my feet.

¹⁷I can count all my bones

while they stare at me and gloat.

¹⁸They divide my garments among them;

for my clothing, they cast lots.

¹⁹But you, O Lord, be not far away;

O my help, hasten to my aid.

²⁰Deliver me from the sword,

my life from the power of the dog.

²¹Save me from the lion's mouth!

From the horns of wild bulls you have rescued me.

²²I will declare your name to my people;

in the midst of the assembly I will praise you.

²³You who fear the LORD, give praise! All you of Jacob's line, give glory.

Stand in awe of the LORD, all you offspring of Israel.

²⁴For the Lord does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty;

neither is the LORD's face hidden from them;

but when they cry out, the LORD hears them.

²⁵From you comes my praise in the great assembly;

I will perform my vows in the sight of those who fear the LORD.

²⁶The poor shall eat and be satisfied.

Let those who seek the LORD give praise! May your hearts live forever!

²⁷All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD;

all the families of nations shall bow before God.

²⁸For dominion belongs to the LORD,
