
~COLOSSIANS 3:14

FALL 2021 WORSHIP "Now the Feast and Celebration"

Can you hear the music in your head? We will sing Marty Haugen's liturgy "Now the Feast and Celebration" in worship for our first liturgical season of the program year. It has been a few years since we sang it together, and it's time to dust it off, mainly because our FAITH PRACTICE for the months of September to December is SACRAMENTS.



A sacrament is a solemn Christian rite instituted by Jesus, and Lutherans celebrate two sacraments: Holy Baptism and Holy Communion. Each of these sacraments symbolizes God's love and grace, connected to an earthly element. In Baptism, we honor the water that washes away our sins and makes us clean, and in Communion, we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ in giving his very body and blood for us, remembered through the bread and wine.



This fall in worship, we will remember the sacraments by celebrating Holy Communion and reciting the Thanksgiving for Baptism, which is similar to Confession. We will do both sacraments in worship every week! Let us join together in love with these tactile reminders of God's love for us.

HOW IS THE SCRIPTURE CHOSEN EACH SUNDAY?

The Bible readings used on Sundays come from the Narrative Lectionary. Professors from Luther Seminary put together the Narrative Lectionary for use by congregations in weekly worship. The readings start in the beginning with the book of Genesis and go chronologically through the Old and New Testaments. We read the grand story of God's love for God's people, as told in the Bible.

FAITH IN DAILY LIFE

She is a wife and a mother. She holds degrees in Art History and French. She has an M.A. from Luther Seminary and is a self-described "reluctant preacher" at Peace. She is a singer and a "ringer." **Lisa Lukis** is all of these things and much more.

Lisa and her husband, Brian, have been members of Peace since 2003. She grew up in Eau Claire, Wisconsin, and did her undergraduate work at Gustavus Adolphus College. Lisa and Brian have three children: Mirah, Daniel, and Gwen. Lisa says that one of her vocations is parenting and that she strives to be an authentic caregiver, raising people "who can in turn be authentically themselves." She remembers being raised surrounded by many wonderful older adults and that it is now her joy to work amongst this age group (at Luther Seminary, she studied aging). For the past four years, she has been a volunteer with Grace Hospice as a companion visitor. In that role, she is matched with a hospice patient. She gets together with this person and responds to whatever they might desire, be

it a conversation partner, a comforting presence, a reader, a tidier, or even a Scrabble opponent. After seminary and before having children, Lisa worked with Presbyterian Homes doing activities. She has also worked at the Weisman Art Museum at the University of Minnesota.

When asked what the main challenges and joys are of her vocation, she replies that the main challenge in all areas of her vocation is that people are complicated! "But," she adds, "I have a lot of curiosity about the spaces between us and how we respond to one another in all phases of life." She says that there is nothing like true and deep soul connection, "where our God-created selves really experience one another." She tries to be a good listener, an encourager, a seeker, and one who brings out the best in others. She adds, "I fail often, but try to return to my deep understanding that everyone is a beloved child of God."

Lisa has worn many hats at Peace Lutheran. Early on in her membership, she helped out with high school youth, including driving a van of students to Chicago. Lisa has served on the church council, has sung with the Celebration Singers. She has helped plan family camps and retreats, served on the Health Ministry committee, facilitated small groups, was a lector, played in the Adult Handbell Choir, and led worship, including - despite her reluctance - doing some preaching.

When asked what thriving looks like to Lisa, she replies that it looks like "being a whole person who experiences suffering and joy, one who is immersed in the both/and – sinner and saint, death and resurrection." Lisa's friends recognize that she not only works towards being a person who experiences life fully with its range of emotions and feelings, but she also brings these qualities out in those around her: with laughter and, when needed, with poignancy and compassion. VACCINES

We all desperately want to get back to "normal" life at church, work, home, and school. We want to gather with friends and family and resume doing the things we used to do. Getting vaccinated and wearing masks are things one can do to protect oneself and the community to help us all get back to that more normal life. The vaccines are proven safe and very effective. With hundreds of millions of doses of vaccines delivered worldwide, their short-term safety and efficacy have been proven. People can get COVID-19 more than once, and studies are now showing getting a vaccine can significantly reduce the risk of getting infected again, even for people who have had COVID infection before.

If COVID-19 is active in the community, the transmission will occur. New mutants or variants may arise that could be more contagious and deadly than the "delta variant" or even not susceptible to vaccine immunity.



Why get the COVID-19 vaccine?

- Vaccines dramatically reduce the risk of getting COVID-19, being hospitalized, or dying from COVID-19 and having "long COVID" symptoms that can persist for months – even if one has already had COVID-19 infection.
- By reducing the chance of getting COVID-19, one's family and friends are less likely to be exposed and potentially infected.
- As more people in the community are vaccinated, there will be fewer infections. That means less viral replication and random mutation, which will reduce the probability of the appearance of variant strains of
 - COVID being more deadly than current strains.
- Masking and getting the vaccine are things in our control to help us all get past the pandemic and sooner get back to as normal a life as possible.

May God be with us all and give us the strength to get through this pandemic.
